

Fiscal Year 2019: Federal-aid Highway Funding by State

On March 11, FHWA issued N4520.259 to distribute \$36.6 billion in Federal-aid highway funding to the states. The state Department of Transportation (DOT) can now obligate a dollar of federal contract authority from any of the highway formula programs from any of its fiscal 2019 apportionments or any remaining formula apportionments from prior fiscal years. Subsequently, on March 15 FHWA issued N510.835 giving state DOTs the additional \$3.2 billion in federal-aid highway funding from the general fund as appropriated in the FY 2019 appropriations act. State DOTs have until September 30, 2022 to obligate the additional \$3.2 billion.

Note: In October 2018, FHWA issued N4510.829 giving states \$599.4 million in (post-sequestration) contract authority exempt from the limitation for the National Highway Performance Program.

The table below shows the amount of total usable Federal-aid highway funding by state for FY 2019 compared with FY 2018 and FY 2017.
